Girls Who Code Work Prep Program hosted by Bank of America Summer 2023

This summer, the Byrne Scholars Program supported me to participate in the Girls Who Code Work Prep Program hosted by Bank of America. This technical and professional development program introduced me to careers and concepts in cybersecurity. Over the course of three weeks, I attended virtual workshops with leaders and engineers at Bank of America who spoke about different cybersecurity roles and potential careers at financial institutions. I also completed asynchronous assignments that taught me about the threat landscape and detection. The program culminated in a final presentation in which I worked on a team to produce an incident response plan to a hypothetical cyber attack.
